What is an Apprenticeship?

- ✓ Employment with training
- ✓ Academic Qualification + Apprenticeship (Credits and Evidence)
- ✓ Funded
- ✓ Grounded in an industry defined 'Standard'
- ✓ Combine academic knowledge and workplace experience

OTJ (off the job) Training

'Training which is received by the apprentice within their practical period, during the apprentice's normal working hours, for the purpose of achieving the knowledge, skills and behaviours of the apprenticeship they are undertaking. By normal working hours we mean the hours for which the apprentice would normally be paid, excluding overtime'

- ✓ Total hours detailed in Training Plan
- ✓ Must be in work time (i.e. if it's at the weekend you need to take TOIL against it)
- ✓ Extra hours
- ✓ All modules are 'mapped' to KSBs (Knowledge Skills & Behaviours) so doing the 'degree' work counts towards your OTJ

Senior Leader Apprenticeship overview

- ✓ Mapped to the L7 Senior Leader Apprenticeship Standard
- ✓ Post Graduate Diploma in Management and Leadership
- ✓ MA Management and Leader / MBA Master of Business Administration
- √ 3 Trimester delivery, 120 credits total
- √ 18 months plus an additional period to complete the End Point Assessment (EPA) 22 months total
- ✓ EPA End Point Assessment

Senior Leader Apprenticeship overview

- ✓ Delivered via 'Blended Learning'
- ✓ Course content and supporting material can be accessed at any time that suits you via our online Learning Management System
- ✓ In-person teaching, including 2-day induction, is delivered in 8 two-day workshops in <u>Cambridge</u>, these are spread throughout the year Trimesters: September, January and May
- ✓ Induction days: HOLD **Tues 9 Dec and Wed 10 Dec**


- ✓ An undergraduate degree from a UK university or an academic or professional qualification
